RE: QUANTUM PROPERTY TRUST NO.9 PRELIMINARY FINAL RESULTS

It is with great pleasure that we present our preliminary review of the full-year performance of Quantum Property Trust No.9 to 30 June 2005, and the preliminary final report. We expect to further expand on these results in the annual report which will be available shortly.

Key achievements during the period include:

- ➤ Net profit increased by 22% from 30 June 2004 to 30 June 2005
- ➤ Total revenue increased by 23% on the corresponding period to \$1,291,575
- Earnings per unit increase of 21% to 19.35 cents per unit
- > Total cash distributed to unit holders in respect of the full year was 8 cents per unit
- ➤ Net asset backing per unit of \$1.07
- Price earnings ratio of 5.17

The directors have prepared the following forecast distribution payment schedule for the financial year ending 30 June 2006, this schedule is a forecast only and is subject to change.

This equates to a total cash distribution of 16 cents per unit, this is double the amount paid for the 2005 financial year, and represents a 16% cash return on unit holders equity.

The trust's main asset is its 25% investment in Quantum Property Syndicate No.9, which owns a retail/commercial property in Queen Street Mall, Brisbane. This asset has performed extremely well for the full-year to 30 June 2005.

Some of the key achievements during the period included;

- Net profit increased by 145% from 30 June 2004 to 30 June 2005, or an 8% increase after eliminating the effects of a change in accounting and one off expenditure incurred in the period ending 30 June 2005.
- Total revenue increased by 5% on the corresponding period to \$3,160,241
- Net asset backing per interest of \$1.06
- Maintained 100% occupancy of the property
- Continued progress in obtaining a joint development agreement with neighbouring properties

The Directors of the Responsible Entity have been delighted with the results of the trust for the full-year and believe the trust is well placed to deliver another strong full year result for 2006.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE UNITHOLDERS OF QUANTUM PROPERTY TRUST NO. 9

Scope

We have audited the financial report of Quantum Property Trust No 9, a Managed Investment Scheme for the year ended 30 June 2005, consisting of the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance and distribution, statement of cash flows, accompanying notes and the responsible entity's declaration set out in this report. The responsible entity, Quantum Syndicate Management Ltd is responsible for the financial report.

We have conducted an independent audit of this financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the unitholders of the Trust.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements, statutory requirements, and the provisions of the Constitution dated 20 February 2003 (as amended) so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Scheme's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of it operations and cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements and the Corporations Act 2001.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, the financial report of Quantum Property Trust No 9 is in accordance with:

- (a) The Corporations Act 2001, including:
 - (i) Giving a true and fair view of the Trust's financial position as at 30 June 2005 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
 - (ii) Complying with Accounting Standards and the Corporations Regulations 2001; and
