1. DIRECTORS' REPORTS:

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:

Dear Fellow Shareholders,

The year so far has been extremely busy, with much time being spent on demonstrations revolving around the Mercedes Benz package. The ARATA conference in South Australia was our first real opportunity to exhibit the wheelchair and Mercedes Benz package. A twenty-minute presentation during the scheduled lunch break ended with a standing ovation from over 200 professionals from across the disability support industry. Unfortunately, this sort of reception has been very consistent but has yet to result in large-scale sales of the Company's products.

Another Expo at Kembla Grange directed at vehicles only for disabled transport and families looked very promising, with sincere expressions of interest. The Global Financial Crisis took hold soon after and none of the parties which had earlier expressed interest have come forward.

Baribunma Mobility was invited to attend the Bus Industry Confederation meeting at Royal Pines Resort on the Gold Coast. Mercedes Benz paid for tickets and the Vito package was on display during the second day. CEO Wally Bancroft was later approached to modify the Baribunma technology used in the electric wheelchair package in order to produce a viable commercial transport seat for busses and coaches. The result was a "roll out" coach seat to be supplied by McConnell's of Melbourne. A prototype has been constructed and is in the testing phase.

Under the influence of director Robert Pringle, the Company's website has been heavily upgraded and is now proving its worth as a marketing tool. Furthermore, a meeting was arranged with Volkswagen, resulting in the development of packages for both the VW Multivan and the VW Caddie. The parent Company is said to be quite excited and negotiations are continuing.

At present two further sales are pending in the ACT, through our very active agent Michael Chandler. Both are for children using the Mercedes Benz package coupled with internal ramps. Whilst sales have been unexpectedly slow due, in no small part, to the financial crisis, our products continue to spark interest and the coach seat has great potential worldwide and is not specifically tied to any disabled user.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT:

The global financial crisis has deepened in the last six months and, like all businesses, Baribunma Holdings has not been immune to the recession. Unfortunately for our business, the crisis could not have come at a worse time. During 2006-2007, the Company invested a great deal of shareholder capital into developing an efficient production process for the Baribunma Electric Wheelchair (and related products). This capital was effectively converted into stock-on-hand to enable the business to guarantee supply and thus develop a network of agents throughout Australia and New Zealand.

The unfortunate part is that, finally, after all this effort and expense, Mercedes Benz Australia was so impressed with the package that Baribunma could offer that they were ready to support further marketing of the product through their extensive network of dealerships. All Mercedes Benz dealers in Queensland and the northern coastal regions of NSW were given live demonstrations of the Baribunma Mercedes Benz Vito Package but the sad fact is that sales have plummeted worldwide and global manufacturers like Mercedes Benz are now more concerned with their own financial stability than expanding their product range. This leaves us with several dozen valuable wheelchairs, which were earmarked for sale as part of the Mercedes Benz package(s) and a Company denuded of working capital due to the enormous production and marketing expenditure incurred in the last three years.

I would like to echo the feeling expressed in Mr. Holden's Chairman's Report and continue to work towards placing the business on a sound financial footing as the economy begins to recover and sales recommence.

The Directors present their report together with the financial report of Baribunma Holdings Limited for the year ended 30th June, 2009 and the Auditor's Report thereon.

Directors have been in office for the full period of this report with the exception of Geoffrey Denyer who left the Board in November, 2008.

P.J. (Wally) Bancroft, Chief Executive Officer.

2. OPERATING RESULTS:

The Company incurred an operating loss of \$ 196,228 for the financial year. Major contributors were weak sales figures and an even poorer than expected economic climate in the first half of 2009. Nevertheless, the Company has sufficient stock on hand to continue to develop markets, particularly in combination with Mercedes Benz and Volkswagen, who are enthusiastically embracing our product. Major expenses were again the compliance costs associated with the continued listing of the Company's securities on the National Stock Exchange of Australia and the continued investment in the Company's extensive intellectual property (IP). Unfortunately, the Company sees these costs as unavoidable, whereas many overseas players entering the local market have significantly less regulation.

3. REVIEW OF OPERATIONS:

A review of the operations of Baribunma Holdings Limited during the financial year found that:

During the year, Baribunma Holdings Limited continued to engage in its principal activity, the results of which are disclosed in the attached financial statements.

4. SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN AFFAIRS:

The Company has had no significant changes in its affairs in the period of this report..

5. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES:

The principal activities of Baribunma Holdings Limited during the financial year were research, development, testing, compliance and marketing of the *Baribunma* Wheelchair.

6. AFTER BALANCE DATE EVENTS:

Particulars of matters or circumstances that have arisen since the end of the financial year which have significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Company, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the Company in future financial years are as follows:

The Company has engaged Mr. Michael O'Connell of A.S. Fisher & Co. to conduct a further round of capital raising to allow the Company to continue with its marketing program. Without this marketing program and the expansion into bus and coach transport seating, the future of the Company is, at best, bleak. Nevertheless, the directors believe that the Company can trade into a position of sustainability if sufficient capital is raised and with the continuing support of government (see below).

In September 2009 the Company successfully applied for a Research and Development Tax Concession, which will result in a return of around \$43,000 to the Company.

7. LIKELY DEVELOPMENTS:

Baribunma Holdings Limited will continue to aggressively market its products and expand its horizon to include bus and coach seating. It is hoped that this will facilitate the possibility of a merger/joint venture with one of the major manufacturers. Such an arrangement will secure

the future of the business for the medium term and provide a financial incentive for shareholders/investors.

8. ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES:

The Company has complied with all environmental regulations under a law of the Commonwealth or of a State or Territory that it was subject to.

9. DIVIDENDS PAID OR RECOMMENDED:

No dividends were paid or declared since the start of the financial year. No recommendation for payment of dividends has been made.

10. DIRECTORS PROFILES AND MEETINGS OF DIRECTORS:

Harold Victor Holden

Harry holds a Bachelor of Engineering from Sydney University and a Diploma from the Australian Institute of Insurance and is an affiliate of the Life Underwriters Association. He has served as a Director in listed Companies such as SSH Medical Limited and in senior management with T & G Life Insurance and APA Life Insurance Ltd. He has further experience as general manager of Dennis Trading & Engineering and Managing Director of Amalgamated Mining Services totaling 14 years. Harry brings a sound management record with growing small-medium enterprises to the business.

Peter John (Wally) Bancroft

Peter (Wally) Bancroft is a leading practitioner in disabled transport in Australia. He has spent much of his working life in the research and development sector including developments for Massey Ferguson Experimental Division before entering the disabled transport industry with Paraquad Engineering in 1987. During seven years with Paraquad he became convinced that it was possible to make significant and unprecedented changes to existing mobility aids including wheelchairs that could enable far greater independence for his disabled clients. Wally was able to develop innovative modifications to electric wheelchairs to improve the quality of life of his customers. Baribunna Holdings was formed to commercialise these innovations and related concepts that Wally has developed over recent years. Wally is an authorised signatory for the N.S.W. Roads and Traffic Authority enabling him to certify vehicle modifications for use by disabled drivers in registered motor vehicles in N.S.W. To the best of our knowledge, his designs were officially approved to enable the first person in Australia to *drive from a wheelchair*. He has served as a consultant and lecturer at the University of Western Sydney (Cumberland College of Health Sciences) and is widely sought as a consultant to other disabled support groups.

Robert Pringle

Robert Pringle joined the Board in early 2008, replacing the retired Don Wild. An employee of Qantas, he has extensive frontline experience in the transport industry and is well placed to assist with the expansion of the Company in Australia and overseas. His experience in the airline industry has convinced him that the Baribunma technology is a much-needed solution to the problems associated with transporting people with high-level disabilities on aircraft. His enthusiasm makes him the ideal person to represent the Company in the transport industry.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting have been applied.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

The charge for current income tax expense is based on the profit for the year adjusted for any non-assessable or disallowed items. It is calculated using the tax rates that have been enacted or are substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is accounted for using the balance sheet liability method in respect of temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. No deferred income tax will be recognised from the initial recognition of an asset or liability where there is no effect on accounting or taxable profit or loss.

Deferred tax is calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realised or liability is settled. Deferred tax is credited in the income statement except where it relates to items that may be credited directly to equity, in which case the deferred tax is adjusted directly against equity.

Deferred income tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future tax profits will be available against which deductible temporary differences can be utilised.

The amount of benefits brought to account or which may be realised in the future is based on the assumption that no adverse change will occur in income taxation legislation and the anticipation that the company will derive sufficient future assessable income to enable the benefit to be realised and comply with the conditions of deductibility imposed by the law.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

(b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of work in progress includes direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Overheads are applied on the basis of normal operating capacity. Costs are assigned on the basis of weighted average costs.

(c) Plant and Equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

(d) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including building and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on either a straight line basis or diminishing value at rates approved by the Australian Taxation Office over the estimated useful lives to the company commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the income statement. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2009

(e) Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the group reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(f) Intangibles

Patents and trademarks

Patents and trademarks are recognised at cost of acquisition. Patents and trademarks have a finite life and are carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any impairment losses. Patents and trademarks are amortised over their useful life ranging from 15 to 20 years.

(g) Research and Development Expenditure

Expenditure during the research phase of a project is recognised as an expense when incurred. Development costs are capitalised only when technical feasibility studies identify that the project will deliver future economic benefits and these benefits can be measured reliably.

(h) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(i) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Other revenue is recognised when the right to receive the revenue has been established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.
