As of 31 December, we have been trading for eight years at San Remo, two years at Cowes and 12 months at Grantville. During this period we have returned to our community \$663,000, accumulated 6,294 accounts, returned \$128,000 in dividends and our branches are staffed by thirteen very friendly capable local people.

We have two towns that wouldn't have had banks and share Cowes with three of "the big 4" banks. The support we are getting from our shareholders and others is extremely gratifying.

Sponsor incentive scheme... how it works

Collectively the three branches of San Remo District Financial Services Limited introduced an incentive scheme in mid-2011 designed to reward clubs and organisations for the referral of new banking business to San Remo District, Cowes, and Grantville & District Community Bank® branches.

Basically we are forming a partnership with community groups who encourage their members to support their local **Community Bank®** branch, which in turn sees the profit of the community Company increased, and the subsequent sharing of this with an increase in sponsorship to the customer's chosen supporter.

The scheme makes a payment to the club or organisation for new business and increase the yearly sponsorship as follows:

New business	Annual increase to sponsorship
Home or business loan up to \$150,000	\$100
Loans greater than \$150,000	\$100
Equipment Finance loan	\$50
Personal loan	\$50
Credit card	\$50
Term deposit or CMA (min bal \$10,000)	\$50
Savings or cheque account	\$10
Other such as insurance etc	\$20

Our first success story comes from Kilcunda Bass Football Club, which recently received \$1,000 from this program, which they have put towards training singlets for their club's senior players. Having accumulated \$1,640 to date from this program, Luke Hill, Greg Kane and their committee were amazed at just how easy that money had come to them, with no hands on labour involved. As they say, "Wow we would have to sell a mighty lot of spinning wheel tickets with a few helpers required to raise those sorts of funds.

It's too easy, 'Supporting your local **Community Bank®** branch with a simple bit of banking, with a home loan, credit card, some insurance and a savings account can easily earn your organisation around \$300, and that is just from one person'.
