was 152% greater than for the same period last year. Our sponsorship and charitable donations for the period was \$124,869. Our total sponsorship and charitable donations for the life of the Company now total \$1,244,447. During the last half year reporting period we also paid dividends to shareholders of \$44,101. Our cumulative return to shareholders by way of dividends now totals \$427,059.

These results are very pleasing indeed and I must also report that Montrose **Community Bank®** Branch is travelling along very nicely. It's no secret that things have slowed up with the property market, and therefore with home loan applications. Montrose Tennis Club has banked with the Mt Evelyn and Montrose **Community Bank®** branches for six years, starting at Mt Evelyn and now more conveniently at Montrose **Community Bank®** Branch. The club had the pleasure in supporting the opening of the Montrose **Community Bank®** Branch.

During the recent drought, the club decided to convert three of their seven courts from water using en-tout-cas to a non-water using synthetic surface. To fund this, the club required a loan of \$15,000. Mt Evelyn **Community Bank®** Branch approved the loan quickly. "We found the staff to be professional in their approach and document preparation and very easy and friendly to deal with", former President Graeme Mathieson said.

Mt Evelyn and Montrose **Community** Bank® branches have also been very generous to our club with grants. The first grant of \$7,000 was to fund the provision of bore water to our remaining en-tout-cas courts, and to assist with the installation of a new kitchen in our clubrooms. Having a reliable water source enabled the club to continue to provide first class tennis facilities to the Montrose community. Also, the new kitchen has enabled the club to provide a modern facility, that can be hired by community members at a low cost, for small functions. Montrose Community Bank® Branch made a further grant of \$1,000 to help fund a wind break on three courts. "This has greatly improved playing conditions of members", Graeme said.

Mt Evelyn Tennis Club up-grade

Thanks to the support of Mt Evelyn **Community Bank**® Branch Mt Evelyn Tennis Club has recently undergone major upgrades to the club facilities. Works on the clubhouse, two courts and new lighting were completed last month after the club received funding for \$190,000 from the State Government, Yarra Ranges Council and Mt Evelyn **Community Bank**® Branch. It now has two synthetic courts, along with the two old en-tout-cas courts and the clubhouse has been fitted with a new kitchen, new carpet and given a lick of fresh paint. Capacity restraints and expansion limitations have now been eased. Also, water savings, lower running costs, less disruptions to play and better lighting will allow for greater usage.

The official opening was attended by Minister for Sport & Recreation, Hugh Delahunty, Member for Evelyn, Christine Fyffe MP, Mayor Shire Yarra Ranges, Cr Graham Warren, and Cr Tim Heenan, along with representatives from Mt Evelyn **Community Bank®** Branch and club members.

Mount Evelyn Tennis Club had been pushing for better courts since 2009, when watering of the en-tout-cas courts became illegal during the height of the drought. A huge influx in membership saw an immediate need for the addition of night tennis teams, which had committee members lobbying for the cause at every opportunity, to great success. The installation of new lights has also resulted in the surrounding areas being lit up, which has made it safer for people walking past the area at night.

"We see this as a fantastic outcome for the club, which has been a major icon in Mt Evelyn for several decades. And as safety is always high on our priorities for community support, the added security outcome from the new lighting is a bonus for our residents as well," Chairperson Ms Rule, from Mt Evelyn & Districts Financial Services Limited said.

Planning Day as crucial for the town.

Raising awareness of local men's health issues, solving a housing shortage, and reinvigorating the town centre were all hot topics for debate at the seventh annual Mount Evelyn Township Planning Day on 9 February 2012, which saw over 80 attendees. The interest has quadrupled in the six years that the event has been running. Those participating included council and community group members, residents, educators, politicians, police officers, firefighters and business people.

"We look forward to the outcomes from the night and to supporting the event for the foreseeable future," Ms Rule said.
