The old salvage truck has served the CFA and the Rye community well but a newer better-equipped vehicle a Hino 816 crew cab light pumper was needed to maintain the high standard of protection needed to safeguard our homes and businesses from the threat of fire.

Initially the CFA needed to raise \$210,000, but current dollar

values and rising costs blew this cost out to \$268,000. It was an excited Captain Mark Boardman and Second Lieutenant Glenn Diamond along with Third Lieutenant Graham Martin that accepted a cheque for \$39,600 from Rye & Dromana **Community Bank**® branches.

Branch Manager Rye **Community Bank®** Branch, Julie Toward, said the new light pumper would be a constant reminder of the strength of this community's spirit.

"If the new pumper is anything like the one it's replacing it will be around for a further 24 years. The combined community support of such an enormous fundraising has achieved an amazing result.
