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\$50,000 committed to local students for further study

With the conclusion of the 2012 Higher School Certificate Examinations on November 8 more than 3,000 students on the Northern Beaches, and 73,000 students across the State, will be anxiously awaiting their results in order to make their transition to a tertiary education course of their choice

At a time when the costs of tertiary education are rising steeply, less than 1% will receive any form of scholarship support from the Universities even if they are academically gifted.

This year, Freshwater Community

worth of tertiary scholarships to students from nine participating high schools in the Manly and Warringah local government areas.

There is no other local Scholarship Program of this kind available on the Northern Beaches.

Local students shine as all round achievers

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Freshwater **Community Bank®**, *Tertiary Scholarship Awards*, each to the value of \$5,000, are designed to see nominated students through the first year of their tertiary studies.

Additionally one of these students will also receive the Freshwater Student of the Year – Ken Ward Memorial Scholarship valued at \$10,000 for the second and third years of undergraduate study.

This additional award is in memory of Ken Ward, the previous Branch Manager of Freshwater **Community Bank®** who passed away in early 2011. It embodies not only academic achievement, but the dedication to community interaction and charitable causes, something that Ken would have supported as part of his enthusiasm for local education and student recognition.

The Yr 12 students were nominated by their respective high schools and fulfilled the three-pronged criteria required for the scholarship:

- Students need to reside within the Manly Warringah area;

- They are required to be academic allrounders & likely to achieve greater than 90% in five 2 unit subjects;

- Additionally, these students need to be actively involved in their community, either within their school, locally, state wide, or internationally.

According to Peter Harley, a volunteer Director of Freshwater **Community Bank**®, who initiated the program says, "Highly talented students have long gone unrecognised beyond their school for their school-based achievements."

He also adds, "There is a profound lack of support for students in their transition from secondary to tertiary education, particularly on the Northern Beaches. This burden has been mostly borne either by students working long hours in the secondary labour market, or with informal support from their family - the so-called 'Mum and Dad' scholarship."

Nominated students included Jovana Zelenbaba from Freshwater Senior Campus, who arrived in Australia from Croatia as a 6 yr. old without speaking a word of English, and topped her class in Extension English; Rachel Nunn from Stella Maris College, who was presented by the Governor with the Marie Bashir Peace Award for her community fundraising activities; Jacob Tsagaris, from St. Paul's College, who apart from excelling academically and in his chosen sport of kayaking, has led a

team of students to Cambodia to build shelters for local underprivileged villages; and Jessica Williams from St. Luke's Grammar, who has been doing similar community work in Uganda.

The Freshwater **Community Bank®** *Tertiary Scholarship Awards* are being presented to the nominated students at their school presentation ceremonies, and the *Freshwater Student of the Year* was announced at Pilu, Freshwater on Friday 23rd November 2012.

Présented by Ken Ward's daughter Samantha, the Freshwater Student of the Year was awarded to Nina Newcombe from Mackellar Girls Campus of the Northern Beaches Secondary College.

Nina impressed the Independent Adjudication Panel with the diversity and high standard of her academic and community involvement activities.



A Community Garden is growing in Freshie

A ready and easily accessible supply of fresh fruit and vegetables is held in great store by any community, and with the recent submission of a Development Application for the Harbord Growers site in Albert Street, which will involve its demolition and subsequent reconstruction, it appears likely that Freshwater will soon lose its ready fruit and vegetable access for the foreseeable future.

But there is a solution! With the growing trend of Community Gardening, there are now 35 community gardens in Greater Sydney with City of Sydney Council claiming 15 of these. Only a few operate on the Northern Beaches, and Warringah Council has now approved its second Community Garden at Crown Reserve, Queenscliff.

Local people of Freshwater and Queenscliff will have the opportunity to grow fresh nutritious produce and participate in a community venture that benefits everyone.

In 2011, following in the footsteps of Manly Vale Community Garden, and assisted by its committee, Friends of Freshwater established a modest two-bin demonstration garden on vacant land at Crown Reserve, between Crown and Queenscliff Roads. There were many features of this site including location within medium density housing; it already had an existing playground, which would be



convenient for contributing families; and is well drained, sunny and has access to water. With the installation of communal composting systems, it will also reduce household waste.

Since the Freshwater Community Garden Committee has been established, draft planning for the site now includes the installation of 12 raised garden beds, water tanks, compost bins and watering systems. In the future, an orchard, and a fedge (food hedge) will also be installed. 20 local residents have signed up for

allotments and Community groups such as schools and disability services will also be invited to become involved once the Community Garden is more established.

Freshie Community Garden is seeking support from local businesses with an interest in supplying plants, shrubs and equipment, so that this site can reach its full potential.
