# Youth Development Program for Year 9 Students

Camp Awakenings is a youth development program for Year 9 students, which is held over two and a half days and focuses on building support networks for the participants by way of friendship and trust. Through self-belief and motivation, participants develop their own methods to counter the challenges faced by the youth of today.

The program began in 2001 with the support of Rotary and has since expanded with interest from various corporate bodies. The camps are coordinated and run by former and current youth leaders, most of whom have attended leadership development courses, for example Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA). The leaders also remain in contact with participants after the camp to assist in further development and support. Two months after the camp there is an opportunity also for participants to come back together as a group to be involved in a 'Recharge' program.

The first camp offered to our local schools in the Yarra Valley, was held at the YMCA Recreation Camp, Mt Evelyn. We were proud to be part of the jointly sponsored event, which saw the collaboration of the districts Rotary Clubs and **Community Bank®** branches in the Yarra Valley. The next camp will be held in July 2013 and camp organisers will soon visit local schools to make a presentation to the students and teachers to recruit this year's participants.

#### Affordable Food Market

#### **Annual Grants Program**

As part of the 2012 AGM proceedings, we were delighted to present local organisations with \$80,000. The mix of applications was wide and varied again this year.

One application this year was from the Junior School Council of Mt Evelyn Primary School. The students, who were directly involved, were extremely enthusiastic about this project, which

was evident when we met with them and Cathy Sanders, Vice Principal.

The students identified two projects and undertook the application process with the school's assistance:

Making History Project - Purchase a set of class ipads to learn and record directly from our local senior residents. The idea was to work alongside the Mt Evelyn History Group and RSL members to make movies, take photographs and make digital images of our local history. The students would pass on their IT knowledge to our senior residents in the process.

**Community Music Project** - Set up a recording studio by purchasing instruments, Apple computers and a microphone. The school has a strong music program and the students wanted a way of sharing, recording and showcasing their music beyond school. A newly formed Community Choir involving three of the local Primary Schools would also benefit from the studio

The students were thrilled that both applications were successful. Two students accompanied by their school Principal, Phil Comport attended our AGM to receive the grants.

In obtaining a grant via Mt Evelyn **Community Bank®** Branch, the students achieved a positive outcome for their school and created wider links to our local senior community.

# **Community Enterprise Project**
