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MMT - GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENT

In the interest of disclosure –

A. GLENFINE (MIN 5492, in renewal)

Ongoing investigations on Glenfine “tailings” continued at Thomastown until 15th of September, 2013. The outcome of those numerous investigations is that –

- 1) A processing procedure has been developed, which appears to overcome the previous “clagging” problems arising from the exceptionally sticky nature of one component of the Glenfine tailings
- 2) Two trials of this new processing procedure (each of 0.5 tonne raw sand) were carried out to completion, using the smaller plant located at Thomastown. It can be noted that this smaller plant, when at Thomastown, operates on clean potable water. The above trials took place on September 12 and 14, 2013. Objectives of these two recent trials included the extraction of sufficient material from the as-run sands to allow further test-work on both the coarser sand, and on that finer “sand” component thought responsible for the “clagging”. It was found that by removal of the finer component the residual (pulp) became amenable to processing.
- 3) The two types of separated material together represent about 8% by weight of the total feed. Currently each type of separated material is under further examination at external laboratories.
- 4) The success of the above two trials suggests that the same process procedure should next be carried out on 10 tonne batches at Glenfine. The process water available for use at Glenfine is not potable, but is an abundant supply. This intended next step will probably follow receipt of analytical data from the laboratory, and may be subject to other considerations.
More information is anticipated in October. The Company is giving consideration to an application for a Research & Development Grant in relation to this new processing procedure, functioning as it does on fluid flow, not mechanisation.

B. CLUNES (MIN 5391)

Directors accept that the market should be informed about the possible changes to ownership of gold rights over the Clunes Goldfield.

The Company has an obligation to disclose events deemed to have commercial significance. The most effective means to communicate current events relating to Clunes Goldfield is by images of authentic recent and/or current plans of tenure.

A set of illustrations is provided on the web-site of the Company – under the Project tab “Clunes”. Very recently an additional drawing was obtained from on-line material available from the State Library of Victoria. (Look under SLV website - South Clunes United). The Exploration Licence Application 5488 (made 15 July 2013) is outlined on that year 1888, making possible an appreciation that ELA 5488 is likely to hold the down-dip mine structures, and encompasses the original battery site, the old South Clunes United gold mine today, private land).

In addition, a set of four plans for the above purposes has been up-loaded to the Home Page.

C. ALLENDALE (EL 3821)

Evaluation of exploration results continues.
