## **Directors' Report**

The Directors of Pegmont Mines Limited submit herewith the financial report for the half-year ended 30 June 2015. In order to comply with the provisions of the Corporations Act, the Directors report as follows: -

# ARMSTRONG, John M. (Non-Executive Chairman) BSc, MBA, Fiin, FAICD

Mr Armstrong, aged 80, is a professional company director with over 40 years experience in investment banking, resource finance and investment management at senior management and director levels.

### MAYGER, Malcolm A. (Executive Managing Director) BCom, CA

Mr Mayger, aged 75, has over 40 years experience in exploration, mining and investment. Malcolm Mayger founded the company in 1987 and has guided its subsequent development from an exploration concept to mining investment and resource evaluation activities.

### READ, Peter J. (Non-Executive Director) B. Ec.

Mr Read, aged 76, is a corporate specialist with experience as a previous managing director with Drillsearch Energy Ltd and Queensland Resources NL. In addition he has extensive experience in marketing and business consulting.

#### **Review of Operations**

The company's operations during the half year to 30 June 2015 resulted in a net loss of \$157,422 an improvement on a loss of \$279,167 to June 2014. This result is after expensing all administration and exploration and resource evaluation expenditure incurred during the six months and including share trading losses of \$10,248 (2014-\$21,953).

The profit/(loss) has been subjected to an independent review by the company's auditor.

#### Activities

No field exploration activities were undertaken by the Company as Vendetta Mining Corp continued to evaluate the Pegmont deposit during the 6 months in accordance with the Purchase Option Agreement with the Company. However, Vendetta has indicated their intention to conduct an active program of drilling during the remainder of 2015 in order to update Inferred Resource over Zone 5 (Southern Lode), estimate an Inferred Resource at the Gossan Lode and conduct metallurgical test work on Gossan and Zone 5 mineralisation.

Vendetta has advised that its direct expenditure on the Pegmont Project from commencement of the Option Purchase Agreement to 10 August 2015, the anniversary date of the EPM tenements, was \$1,073,062 plus administration costs of \$107,306. Together with prior expenditure incurred by Pegmont Mines Limited total expenditure comfortably exceeds expenditure requirements of EPMs 14491 and 1506 with one year to spare.

Vendetta's intention is to continue the drill program into 2016 in order to generate sufficient inferred Resources to provide the basis for a scoping study and justification for consolidation of the Pegmont Project tenements.

### **Changes In State Of Affairs**

During the half year the Company has reduced corporate expenditure including deferred Directors' Fees (\$30,000) to approximately \$250,000 per annum which equates to anticipated receipts of \$250,000 from Vendetta Mining Corp's second option payment due November 2015. The Company is now in a financially sustainable position for the first time in a number of years. Apart from that ,there was no significant change in the Company's state of affairs other than that referred to in the half year accounts or notes thereto.

# 1. Basis of Preparation of Half-Year Financial Statements

### Mineral tenement leases

In order to maintain current rights of tenure to mining tenements, the Company will be required to outlay during 2015/16 amounts of approximately \$25,000 (2014/2015 \$425,000) only in respect of tenement lease rentals. However, additional exploration expenditures to meet the minimum expenditure requirements in accordance with the Option Purchase Agreement with Vendetta will be undertaken.
