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INFORMATION FOR MEMBERS AND PROSPECTIVE INVESTORS

CLUNES DRILL HOLE CD15-07, collared at Site C, within MIN 5391.

This hole intersected two zones of mineralized ground - one a 12 metre quartz interval typical of the Clunes Goldfield, and the other lower zone, an interval of the type of material seen in drilling earlier in 2015.

The information given to the NSX on 16 November 2015 about the lower intersected interval was incomplete. It is here modified through recent observation, as follows.

The hole continued to a final depth of 180.2 metres - still in ground of significant interest for geological reasons. At depth 180 m., the hole azimuth is 263.8 M., at minus 74.7 degrees.

The observed lower mineralized "interval" is very substantially increased, as follows –

- Depth 142.8 metres - beginning of an intensely sheared and mineralized quartz structure, best described as "lode stuff".
- This zone of lode stuff continues to hole depth 154.9 metres.
- Another similar interval occurs between 157.4 and 160.2 metres.
- Other shorter intervals of interest occur to end of hole.

The hole is being held intact, as cored, for the present, pending observations from subsequent drilling at this site.

All observers will be well satisfied that the core through these two intersections shows no evidence of proximity to old workings.

CLUNES DRILL HOLE CD15-08

This hole is being drilled from about the same collar position, Site C., at minus 63 degrees, on a similar azimuth to hole CD15-07.

The hole is progressing in the normal manner.

As at close of work yesterday, hole CD15-08 had reached and cored about 3 metres of a first quartz interval, at depth 74.6 metres.
