

Community Welfare

Investment in the Community Welfare sector focused on services that provide safety, care, and essential resources to individuals facing hardship. Funding supported emergency relief programs, crisis housing providers, and counselling and mental health services. Our contributions also helped expand capacity for family violence services and youth outreach programs. These investments directly improve lives, delivering critical support where and when it's needed most.

We provided funds for the **Go Girls Work Ready Program**. The program supports women from all walks of life—whether long-term unemployed, recovering from illness, survivors of domestic violence, teen mothers, migrants, or those facing other challenges—are empowered to rebuild their confidence, re-enter the workforce, and embrace leadership opportunities. Our significant funding contribution to the **Learning for Life Autism Centre** this year has played a vital role in ensuring that children with autism—and their families—receive the support they need, when they need it most. 
Education

Over the past 12 months, we increased our support for the education sector—funding vital projects that make a real difference in the lives of young people. Our investment in education is helping to create a more inclusive and equitable future for students of all abilities and backgrounds.

We provided **Belmore School** with essential equipment to enhance learning and care for students living with severe physical disabilities, complex health conditions, and multiple support needs. This funding helps create a more accessible and supportive learning environment for some of the most vulnerable students.
