#### **Principal Activities**

The principal activity of the company during the course of the financial period was in facilitating **Community Bank®** services under management rights to operate a franchised branch of Bendigo and Adelaide Bank Limited.

#### **Review and Results of Operations**

Operations have continued to perform in line with expectations. The net profit of the company for the financial period after the provision of income tax was: \$175,467 [2010: \$159,143].

Manningham Community Enterprises Limited's (MCEL) contribution to the community during the past 10 years both Financially and with man power has been outstanding but as a Board we have always been asking ourselves 'can we do more'.

In late 2010 The Board commenced investigations into the possibility of becoming involved with some larger Community Projects and to this end approached Council to identify needs in the community which would have demands beyond Councils' and MCEL's individual capacities.

The result was some very exciting 'joint' proposals which culminated in a Partnership between Manningham City Council and Manningham Community Enterprises Limited whereby in December 2011 a Memorandum of Understanding was created identifying the development of two 'Highball' Projects, Sheahan's Road Basketball Stadium (home of the Bulleen Boomers) and Donvale Indoor Sports Centre with a total Project cost of \$25million, with MCEL to make a \$1million contribution over 10 years.

The Developments will be multi-user complexes with activities identified as 'Education through Recreation'.

The MCEL contribution has been professionally costed to ensure it has no affect on existing community contributions from profits, contributions from the Community Enterprise Foundation or shareholder dividends.

As part of the 'Partnership Package' MCEL has not only got naming rights to both venues but naming rights to the exclusive new Art Gallery and an exclusive ATM sighted within the new 'City Hub' complex known as MC2 (MC squared).

#### Review and Results of Operations (continued)

The 'Projects' are only in their infancy with much more work to be done but The Chairman and Board members are very excited at the potential this 'Partnership' with Council has, not just with the development of these two sites but with other substantial community projects which may be identified in the future.

In the opinion of the directors there were no significant changes in the state of affairs of the company that occurred during the financial year under review not otherwise disclosed in this report or the financial statements.

#### Matters Subsequent to the End of the Reporting Period

There are no matters or circumstances that have arisen since the end of the half year reporting period that have significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the company, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the company.
