Our Community Bank® branch continues to lead

Doncaster East Community Bank® Branch continues to be one of the fastest growing Community Bank® branches in Australia.

In the six months to December 2004 it again led the way in Victoria and was in the top five of the Community Bank® branch network in Australia, which now boasts 143 branches.

This repeats the performance the branch achieved in its first year of operations. The branch opened in March 2003 and, in the six months to December 2003, had recorded the highest growth of all 32 Melbourne metropolitan Community Bank® branches.

The Chairman of Doncaster East Community Financial Services Limited, the Company that operates the branch, Jim Christie, said this was a remarkable achievement.

"It is to be expected that a branch will grow quickly soon after opening but we were extremely proud that during our initial months we grew the fastest in Melbourne," he said.

"But to repeat that performance during the second year of operations while other new branches were opening and enjoying the initial burst of growth is truly remarkable."

The branch now has well in excess of \$50 million in sound profitable business and is well ahead of this years budgeted growth projections. The Company confidently expects to report its first trading profit this financial year.

During the past 12 months the business has also made significant advances in non-financial areas including:

- Development of a range of policies and procedures to provide a proper basis for future governance and decision making
- Conducting a review of the Board's performance and the performance of each Director
- Successfully implementing the requirements of the Financial Services Reform Act (FSRA)
- · Maintaining high standards of branch operational efficiency
- Reviewing the Company's marketing strategy in the light of the first 12 months of operations
- Further training and development of our dedicated staff
 Despite obvious success to date the Company's Directors
 and management are anything but complacent about the future.

"We are operating in a highly competitive market and since we opened the doors of the Doncaster East Community Bank® Branch a further three bank branches have followed our lead and opened up within the Manningham City Council district," Mr Christie said.
