Principal Activities

The principal activity of the company during the course of the financial period was in facilitating **Community Bank®** services under management rights to operate a franchised branch of Bendigo and Adelaide Bank Limited.

Review and Results of Operations

Further confirmation of the financial effect will be available in the 2011 annual report.

Note 1. Basis of Preparation of the Half-Year Financial Statements

The half-year financial statements are a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*, Australian Accounting Standards, *AASB 134: Interim Financial Reporting*, Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

The half-year financial report is intended to provide users with an update on the latest annual financial statements and does not include all the notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report. Accordingly the report shall be read in conjunction with the annual financial report for the year ended 30 June 2010 and any public announcements made by the company during the

The same accounting policies and methods of computation have been followed in this interim financial report as were applied in the most recent annual financial statements and the previous corresponding interim period.

The half-year financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

Adoption of new and revised Accounting Standards

During the current year the entity has adopted all of the new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations which became mandatory.

The adoption of these standards has impacted the recognition, measurement and disclosure of certain transactions. The following is an explanation of the impact the adoption of these standards and interpretations has had on the financial statements of the company.

AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements

In September 2007 the Australian Accounting Standards Board revised AASB 101, and as a result there have been changes to the presentation and disclosure of certain information within the financial statements. Below is an overview of the key changes and the impact on the company's financial statements.

Disclosure impact

Terminology changes – The revised version of AASB 101 contains a number of terminology changes, including the amendment of the names of the primary financial statements.

Reporting changes in equity – The revised AASB 101 requires all changes in equity arising from transactions with owners in their capacity as owners to be presented separately from non-owner changes in equity. Owner changes in equity are to be presented in the statement of changes in equity, with non-owner changes in equity presented in the statement of comprehensive income. The previous version of AASB 101 required that owner changes in equity and other comprehensive income be presented in the statement of changes in equity.

Note 3. Events Subsequent to Reporting Date

On 22 February 2011 the company's franchise partner Bendigo and Adelaide Bank Limited announced that commencing 1 April 2011 two income streams (Term Deposits greater than 90 days and Fixed Rate Home Loans) will have their trailing commission cut from 0.5% to 0.375%. Due to the recent establishment of the company and **Community Bank®** branch a supplementary commission will be received equivalent to the 0.125% reduction in trailing commission for the period 1 April 2011 to 31 March 2012. Bendigo and Adelaide Bank Limited will conduct a further review to determine whether the supplementary commission will continue from 1 April 2012. The board estimates that the change will not be material in the 2011/12 year because of the compensation package provided but will continue to monitor budgets to ensure maximisation of returns to shareholders and the community. Further confirmation of the financial effect will be available in the 2011 annual report.

There have been no other events subsequent to reporting date that would materially effect the financial statements at the reporting date.
