As at the end of June we are still tracking well, even with sizeable deposit funds being withdrawn in late June due to the recent superannuation changes which come into effect on 1 July 2006.

Our modified target for the first year was almost \$18 million. I'm pleased to report that on our birthday we were only \$120,000 short of \$16 million of banking business on our books. We have just over \$0.5 million of loans approved and to be settled by the end

of July, and we are currently working on deals of approximately \$3 million. I'm confident these will also be settled by the end of July. An excellent result for our little branch. Thank you to all the people and shareholders who continue to support us. Don't forget to mention us to all your family, friends and acquaintances so we can grow our business as quickly as possible.
